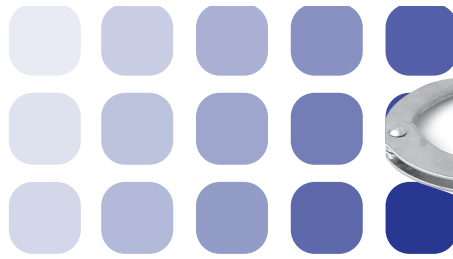

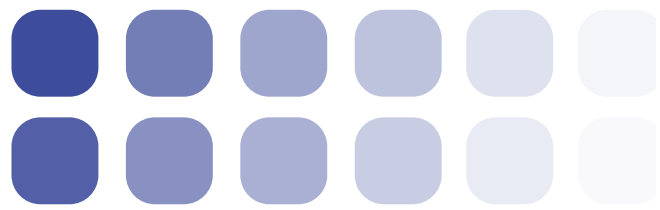

Program Specific Admission Requirements

- Security Clearance Check
- Driver's Abstract
- Applicants must have a Grade 12 high school diploma or equivalent. Emphasis will be placed on spelling and sentence structure.

Non-Academic Requirements

- Applicants are required to complete a questionnaire outlining their motivation to seek entry to a career in the criminal justice field, their work experiences and additional educational information. This questionnaire also includes a request for a handwritten essay. An interview with admissions is required. The interviewer assesses the integrity, forthrightness and sincerity of the applicant.

Note: Previous job and life experience, education and the recruitment process may be factors in the opportunities available to you.
